

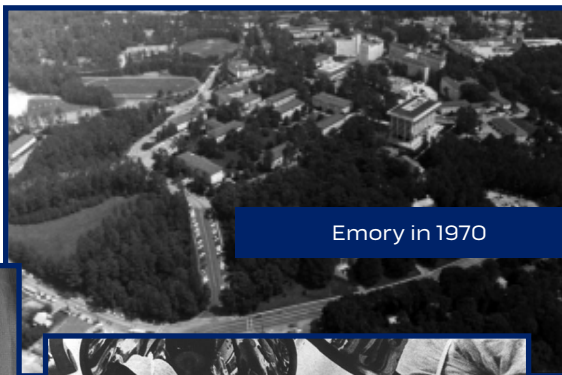

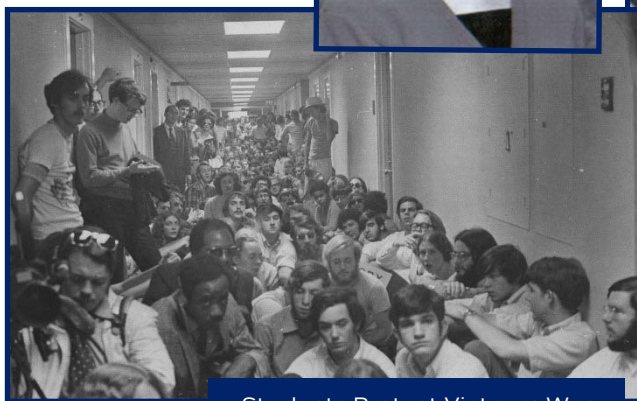

What was happening 50 years ago when Marie Hodo first came to work at Emory? Here is a quick glance back to **1970-1971**:

- Delores Aldridge became the first African American scholar to hold a tenure-track position in Emory College and she founded the Black Studies program, known today as the Department of African American Studies.
- Dr. Charles Hatcher performed Georgia's first successful coronary bypass at Emory University Hospital.
- Emory students received more freedom in choosing courses to meet basic academic requirements. Dorm visitation was expanded to 24-hours for the men's dorms and the women's dorms opened up on a more limited basis.
- Students on campus protested the Vietnam War, as well as the incidents at Kent State University and the presence of an ROTC unit on the Emory campus. The Board of Trustees recognized students' right of dissent but stipulated that it must be "orderly and peaceful, and represent constructive alternatives reasonably presented."

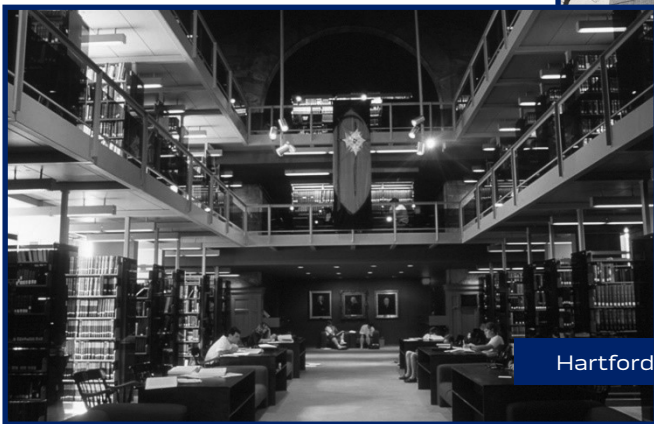
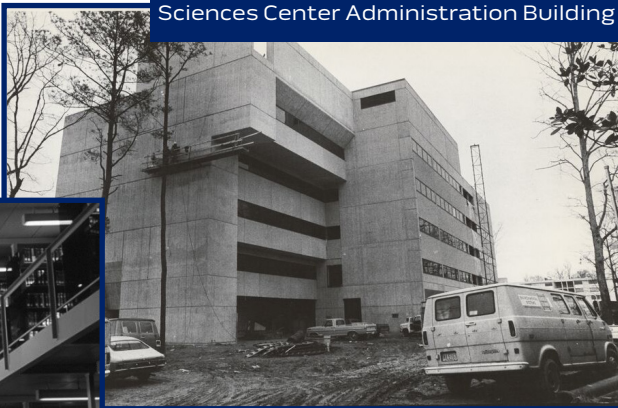

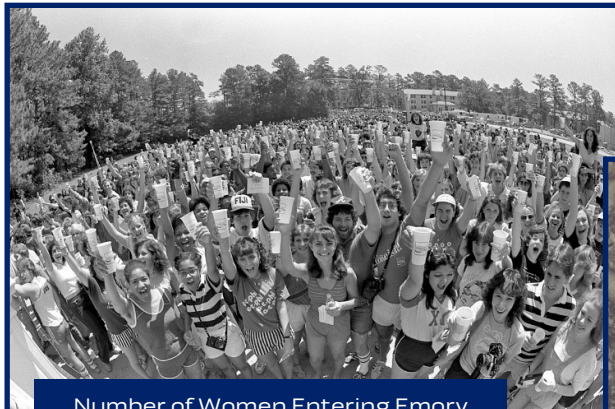
Hartford Seminary Book Collection Purchased

Here's a snapshot of events taking place 45 years ago (1975-1976):

- President Sanford Atwood created the President's Commission on the Status of Women to advise him on issues pertaining to women, including recruitment and hiring.
- The Woodruff Health Sciences Center Administration Building was dedicated in 1976.
- Emory's purchase of the 220,000-volume Hartford Seminary book collection helped make the theology library one of the best in the nation.

- The number of women entering the college equaled the number of men for the first time.
- Emory students launched Volunteer Emory, a clearinghouse for student volunteers, a major force in student life that continues today.
- Woodruff professorships funded by the \$105 million gift from Robert and George Woodruff were established to attract to Emory a critical mass of internationally distinguished men and women. The Robert W. Woodruff scholarships and fellowships were created to attract outstanding students to the University.

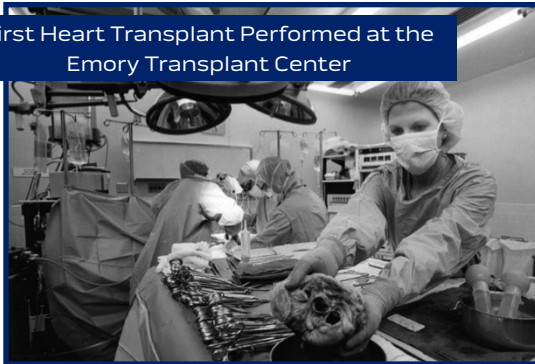

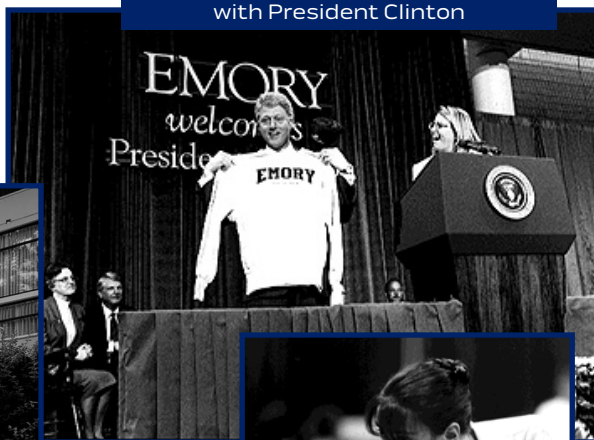

Here's what was happening twenty-five years ago, in **1995-1996**:

- President Bill Clinton and Vice President Al Gore led an economic summit held at Cannon Chapel.
- Atlanta hosted the Olympics and the U.S. Women's Gymnastics squad won the gold medal in the gymnastics team competition. The "Magnificent 7" lived on Emory's campus during the Olympics, and President William M. Chace hosted a reception for the gymnasts in the Michael C. Carlos Museum after their win.
- Emory hosted the bocce ball competition of the Atlanta Paralympic Games, held soon after the Centennial Olympic Games.
- Emory became the first private university in the South to extend benefits to same-sex domestic partners of employees.
- The Emory Conference Center Hotel opened in the hardwood forest off Houston Mill Road. Designed to fit harmoniously into the natural environment, the facility featured guest rooms and meeting space.
